Community foundations are tax-exempt, nonprofit, autonomous, nonsectarian, philanthropic institutions.

Community Foundations:

- Build permanent funds
- Pool and leverage resources
- Process complex financial vehicles

- Offer significant tax advantages
- Provide administrative support
- Protect your charitable dollars

The long-term goal of any community foundation is to build permanent funds supported by many donors to benefit charitable causes within the local area.

Leaving a Living Legacy: Eddy & Sherry Schultz



- Eddy & Sherry decided to support two special project funds by donations of:
- \$35,000 was matched for Swimming Pool Fund and
- \$42,500 was matched for the Motorcycle Museum Fund
- The Senior Living Fund received \$3,500.
- Their two donations raised an additional \$77,500 for these two projects.

Leaving a Legacy: Rachael Keller



- Rachael's family chose to establish a memorial in Rachael's memory
- Generous memorial donations of over \$78,500 were made to the newly formed Senior Living for Cheyenne County Field of Interest Fund in Rachael's memory.
- The donations to this field-of-interest fund allows the local foundation board to address current and future seniors' needs in our community as they arise.

Leaving a Living Legacy: Bill & Cindy Keller



- Bill and Cindy decided to support five funds by cash donations of over \$700,000:
- \$75,000 was matched for the Senior Living Fund in 2012 and
- \$280,000 currently given to the New Generation Endowment Fund
- Their two donations helped helped raise an additional \$80,000 for these two funds.
- They donated \$15,000 to the Swimming
 Pool and will donate all the Electrical
 Supplies for the new pool
- The Unrestricted Fund received
 \$320,000 to support many projects.
- The Motorcycle Museum received
 \$20,000 in Electrical Supplies.

Leaving a Legacy: Kari Milliken Gilliland



- Kari's family chose to establish a memorial in Kari's memory based on the generous memorials given on her behalf.
- \$10,320 were donated to the swimming pool fund in Kari's honor.
- This special purpose fund allows the local foundation to address the specific need of a new swimming pool in our community.

Building a Living Legacy: Scott Jenkins




- Scott Jenkins, former board member, sought to support the Swimming Pool & Recreation Fund by seeking sponsors for his run in the Leadville 100 Ultra Marathon:
- Scott sought corporate and local individual donors to pledge \$157.30 / mile for or each mile he completed in this grueling race in August 2015.
- He raised raise \$15,730 for this fund.

Leaving a Legacy: Ethel Whitten



- Ethel's family chose to establish a memorial in Ethel's memory
- Generous matching fund donation of over \$10,000 was made to the newly formed St. Francis Swimming Pool Fund in Ethel's memory.
- This special purpose fund allows the local foundation to address the specific need of a new swimming pool in our community.

Leaving a Legacy: Willard Zweygardt



- An anonymous donor chose to give a memorial in Willard's memory
- A generous donation of \$10,000 was made to the Senior Living Fund in Willard's memory. This donation provided funds allowing the Good Samaritan Village – Cheyenne County to remodel the west entrance
- Another generous matching pledge of \$40,000 was made to help build the New Generation Endowment Fund.

Building a Living Legacy: Carl Werner



- Carl decided to support the USD
 297 Education Fund by
 establishing this fund for the benefit
 of the USD 297 school district
- Carl encourages other donors to make donations to this fund.
- The school board and superintendent have sole discretion on how the grant funding will be utilized.
- Carl made an initial donation of \$100,000 to this fund.

Funds

There are three primary Funds managed by the Foundation and a number of special project funds:

New Gen Endowment Foundation

- Only earnings (no principal) from this fund can be spent for charitable purposes for the betterment of St. Francis and Cheyenne County.
- All donations in 2016 up to \$320,000 were eligible to be matched 1:1 by Bill and Cindy Keller and the Willard Zweygardt Memorial Fund.

Senior Living Fund

 Principal and interest income may be utilized for charitable purposes that provide or support senior living and/or long-term care in Cheyenne County, both for the aged and those in need.

Grow St. Francis Unrestricted Fund

 Allows donors to fund future needs of our community without any constraints. The local advisory board has full discretion for utilizing these funds. It is typically used to fund unexpected charitable needs that arise within the community.

Special Projects Funds

- Community projects that need a tax-deductible vehicle in which to fundraise to complete the project:
 - Swimming Pool and Recreation Fund
 - Motorcycle Museum Fund
 - USD 297 Education Fund
